- 4. Have your High School transcripts sent to Dunwoody
- 5. Work with your Admission's Counselor and the Registrar's Office to determine your final schedule

PSEO: DEGREE PATHWAYS FOR CYBER, CLOUD, NETWORKING, AND WEB DEVELOPMENT

Dunwoody's Computer Technology curriculum is intentionally designed with a common first-semester to give students a solid foundation in a broad range of computer disciplines, allowing them to easily transfer between programs without losing time or credits.

FIRST-YEAR COURSES MAY INCLUDE:

- CLDE 1110: Introduction to Cloud Services (2 credits)
- CDEF1110: Introduction to Cyber Defense (2 credits)
- CNTS 1112: Introduction to Systems and Networking (3 credit)
- CWEB 1116: Application Design I (3 credits)
- MATH 1250: Boolean Algebra (3 credits)

In addition to the technical courses listed above, students will also be able to choose from several general education electives.

Official course schedule will be determined by the Registrar's Office and may vary by student.

Can't make a full-time, on-campus PSEO program work for your schedule? Dunwoody College of Technology offers part-time Post Secondary Enrollment Options for Minnesota high school juniors and seniors, providing a perfect way to save time and money on your Dunwoody degree.

What is PSEO?

PSEO is a state-wide program that allows 11th and 12th grade students to take college courses for free while still in high school. Students earn both college and high school credit by successfully completing the course.

Am I good fit for Dunwoody's PSEO program?

The PSEO program at Dunwoody is geared for students who are interested in earning a technical degree after high school. Students who are admitted into the program will need to select a degree major prior to enrollment. In addition, students must have a minimum high school GPA of 2.5 and be in good academic standing with their institution.

How do I enroll in PSEO courses at Dunwoody?

- 1. Complete the Application to Dunwoody College
- Complete the PSEO forms found in the "Acceptance Process" section on dunwoody.edu/pseo
- Have your high school counselor complete the PSEO Worksheet
- 4. Have your official high school transcript sent to Dunwoody

When do I need to apply by?

Both Fall and Spring starts are available.

- Fall Enrollment: May 30 of your sophomore or junior year
- Spring Enrollment: Nov. 1 of your junior or senior year

Do I have to pay anything?

No. PSEO courses are free, with no cost to the student, including tuition, books, and fees.
